Get Your SacRT Student Photo ID Card Now

Why wait until the school year begins? Get your SacRT Student ID card now and ride at a discounted rate all summer!

The photo ID cards are available for only \$2 during the months of June, July and August. The card regularly sells for \$3, so take advantage of the cost savings. Students, grades K to 12, must show proof of school enrollment or be accompanied by a parent or guardian to receive the SacRT Student ID card. To purchase the photo ID, stop by the Customer Service and Sales Center located at 1225 R Street, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

With a Student ID card, passengers may purchase monthly and semi-monthly student stickers at retail outlets throughout the Sacramento region. A current sticker must be affixed to a current SacRT Student ID card in order to be valid.
